

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Discovering the Chapelle du Rouet

The chapel is located on the Cap de la Vierge, to the east of the center of the village. It is a place of peace and spirituality, nestled between sea and hill with breathtaking views of the coast. It is built on a triangular promontory wooded with Aleppo pines and thorny bushes (garrigue). The chapel overlooks the sea, the creeks and the harbor of Marseille.

On the summit, you can admire to the west: the Plage du Rouet and its port. To the east stands the Calanque des Eaux-Salées and its railway viaduct, sheltered between two cliffs.

Inside the chapel, you will discover a statue dedicated to Notre-Dame du Rouet, representing the Virgin seated and nursing her child.

The current building was built in the 17th century.

The date 1653 is inscribed on the lintel of the door (reconstituted since the restoration of the building). This chapel "replaces the ancient chapel which already existed at the time of the first appearances of the Saracens",

A little history...

(excerpt from the inscription engraved on a stone in 1877).

The oldest document making mention of this "antique chapel" date from 4.12.1253.

A historical note said "Our Chapel of Rouet was a watchtower of the abbey of Saint-Victor which it has a time a time Sunday property". She received as such the first greeting from ships returning from the coast. She also had the property of a small herd of sheep.

The chapel was restored and enlarged in 1877. Left without maintenance after the 1914-1918 war, it was threatened with total ruin. Enterprising Carryens, helped by the municipality (the building being municipal) completely renovated it. It has been embellished with three stained glass windows, designed and made by Father Antoine SIMONI, former parish priest of Carry-le-Rouet. At sunrise, the Virgin faces south. The vaulted openings in pink stone of the Crown are at the entrance of the chapel, (near the cross with Christ cut out against the sky).

Pilgrimages and guided tours

- Feast of the Nativity of the Virgin with blessing of the sea and boats (1st or 2nd Sunday of September).
- Candlemas Festival with blessing of candles and shuttles (1st Sunday of February).
- Guided tours for Heritage Days and in summer on registration at the Tourist Office.

How to get there?

Pass in front of Rouet beach and take Avenue Blanche Calvet. Take the Chemin des Eaux Salées then the Chemin de la Vierge. The chapel is at the top, going up the stairs on the right. <u>Distance</u>: about 10min to 15min on foot from Rouet beach. The chapel is only open during guided tours but the site remains accessible all year round.
